## 2007 SUMMER LEAGUE INFORMATION



The Washington Wizards return to Thomas & Mack Center and Cox Pavilion in Las Vegas, Nevada for the 2007 NBA Summer League presented by adidas. This is the fourth consecutive year that the Wizards are competing in Las Vegas. Washington's 2007 NBA Summer League team features the Wizards' two 2007 draft picks: first round pick Nick Young (Southern California) and second round pick Dominic McGuire (Fresno State), as well as Washington's 2006 first round pick Oleksiy Pecherov, who will make his second consecutive appearance in Las Vegas. The Wizards are 6-10 all-time in Las Vegas (2004: 4-1, 2005: 2-4, 2006: 0-5).

## SHAGARI ALLEYNE #4

Center, 7-3 Manhattan



**COLLEGIATELY:** Did not play during the 2006-07 season at Manhattan due to NCAA transfer requirements...Played at the University of Kentucky for three seasons before transferring to Manhattan...Played in 68 games as a Kentucky Wildcat, and averaged 2.0 points and 1.4 rebounds per game...Averaged 2.0 points and 1.3 rebounds in his junior year, including two starts...Scored a career-high 16 points and grabbed six rebounds against Georgia State (12/6/05)...Appeared in 29 games and finished seventh in SEC with 1.52 blocks per game as a sophomore for the Wildcats...Also shot 65 percent from the field (30-of-46) as a sophomore.

**PERSONALLY:** Born January 14, 1984...Son of Robert and Claudia Alleyne...Has one brother, Robert, Jr...In high school, averaged 21.0 ppg, 14.0 rpg and 5.0 bpg as a senior at Rice High School in New York, NY...Was a three-year starter in high school, and compiled an 82-28 record during his tenure...Was a three-time All-City selection and helped lead his team to city and state titles as a junior...Played in the Michael Jordan Capital Classic in 2003.



## BRIAN CHASE #15

Guard, 5-9 Virginia Tech



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Was a member of the Utah Jazz for the first seven games of the 2006-07 season, but did not see game action...Started 32 games for the Los Angeles D-Fenders of the NBDL in 2006-07...Ranked second on the D-Fenders with an average of 16.7 points per game...Appeared in the final three regular season games (two starts) for the NBA D-League's Roanoke Dazzle in 2005-06, and averaged 13.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 6.0 assists in 42.0 minutes per game...Following the 2005-06 D-League season, joined the Nebraska Cranes of the United States Basketball League...Appeared in 23 games (18 starts), and averaged 19.9 points, 4.1 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.65 steals in 37.9 minutes per game to help lead the Cranes to the 2006 USBL title...Also appeared in 48 games for the Gary Steelheads of the CBA in 2005-06, and averaged 15.1 points, 2.9 rebounds and 4.1 assists in 29.9 minutes per game...Played 13 games for the Maryland Nighthawks of the American Basketball Association in 2004-05, and averaged 18.4 points and 2.3 assists per game.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Averaged 10.8 points, 2.8 rebounds and 1.9 assists in 103 games during his collegiate career at Virginia Tech (1999-03)...Finished as Hokies' all-time leader in three-point accuracy (.409) and scored over 1,000 points in his collegiate career...Twice led the Big East in three-point accuracy...Appeared in 27 games as a senior in 2002-03, and averaged 7.1 points, 2.4 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game...Saw action in 28 games as a junior in 2001-02, and posted averages of 11.3 points, 2.1 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game...Averaged 12.9 points, 2.9 rebounds and 2.1 assists as a sophomore in 2000-01...Led the Big East in three-point shooting at .458 (47-58) in the Hokies' first season in the conference...Averaged 12.9 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.3 assists in 24 games (18 starts) as a freshman in 1999-00...Named to the 2000 Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team.

**PERSONALLY:** Full name is Brian Matthew Chase...Born in Washington, DC...Son of Catreeda Lloyd...Attended Dunbar High School in Washington, DC...Named to the All-Metro First Team as a senior at Dunbar...Earned his degree in human services from Virginia Tech in December, 2003.



**MIKE HALL #42**  
Forward, 6-8 George Washington



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Originally signed as a free agent by Washington on September 13, 2006...Released by Washington on October 30, 2006...Signed by Washington to a 10-day contract on February 28, 2007...Signed a second 10-day contract with Washington on March 10, 2007...Signed by Washington for the remainder of the 2006-07 season on March 20, 2007...Appeared in two regular season games for Washington...Made his NBA debut at CHA (4/3/07) and finished with two points, one rebound and one assist...Appeared in 29 games this season for the Tulsa 66ers in the D-League and averaged 15.6 points and 8.5 rebounds per game, while shooting 49 percent from the field...Ranked ninth in the D-League in rebounding (8.5 rpg)...Averaged 3.8 points and 3.4 rebounds in five preseason games with the Washington Wizards in October, 2006...Played for the Denver Nuggets in the 2006 Toshiba Vegas Summer League and averaged 5.0 points and 3.4 rebounds per game in five summer league contests.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Posted career averages of 10.4 points and 7.9 rebounds per game in 117 collegiate games with the George Washington Colonials...Was a member of two George Washington NCAA tournament teams...Named to the 2006 Atlantic 10 All-Conference Second Team.

**PERSONALLY:** Full name is Michael Horus Hall...Hobbies include bowling and billiards...Majored in exercise science at George Washington.



**JARED HOMAN #54**  
Forward/Center, 6-10 Iowa State



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Played in 14 FIBA Europe Cup games for Maroussi Athens during the 2005-06 season, and posted averages of 8.2 points and 3.6 rebounds per game...Competed in the 2005 Reebok NBA Summer League for the Sacramento Kings and the 2005 Southern California Summer Pro League for the Miami Heat.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Finished career as Iowa State's all-time leader in blocks (235), which is the fifth-best total in Big 12 history...Recorded a block in 99 of 125 career games and recorded nine games with at least five rejections...Became the 23<sup>rd</sup> player in school history to score 1,000 points (1,124)...Earned All-Tournament honors at the 2005 Portsmouth Invitational Tournament, and averaged 16.3 points and 10.7 rebounds in three games...As a senior, was named Third-Team All-Big 12 and was named to the Big 12 All-Underrated Team...Averaged 13.6 points, 8.7 rebounds and 2.1 blocks and was the only Cyclone to start all 31 games as a senior...Led the Big 12 and ranked 41<sup>st</sup> nationally in blocked shots, posting the fourth-best single-season total (64) in school history...Was second in the Big 12 with 12 double-doubles, and scored in double figures in 26 of 31 contests in his final collegiate season.

**PERSONALLY:** Son of Dave and RaNae Homan...His parents are dairy farmers...Majored in finance at Iowa State.



**LEE HUMPHREY #16**

**Guard, 6-2 Florida**



**COLLEGIATELY:** Was a key contributor on the Florida Gators back-to-back (2006, 2007) national championship teams...Is the NCAA Tournament's all-time leader in three-pointers made (47)...Left UF as the school's all-time leader in three-pointers made (288)...In two Final Fours, knocked down 18 three-point attempts...Led Florida with 23 points against Oregon in the 2007 Midwest regional final, hitting a career high-tying seven shots from long distance...Hit 4-of-7 shots from downtown against Ohio State in the 2007 national championship game...Was a First Team Academic All-America in 2007 and a Second Team member in 2006...Was a two-time SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year for men's basketball.

**PERSONALLY:** A native of Maryville, Tennessee...Served as the President of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes Chapter at the University of Florida.



**DOMINIC MCGUIRE #5**

**Forward, 6-8 Fresno State**



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Was selected in the second round (47<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2007 NBA Draft by the Washington Wizards.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Earned Second Team All-WAC honors as a junior in his final collegiate season...Was also named to the conference's All-Newcomer Team and the All-Defensive Team...Started his collegiate career at California before transferring to Fresno State...Sat out the 2005-06 season under NCAA transfer rules...As a junior at Fresno State, averaged 13.5 points and 9.8 rebounds, while ranking fifth in the nation in blocked shots (3.6 bpg)...Set a school single-season record with 114 blocked shots...Recorded 15 double-doubles and two triple-doubles...In his sophomore season at California, averaged 7.2 points, 4.9 rebounds and a team-high 1.1 blocked shots in 24.6 minutes per contest...Scored in double figures 11 times.

**PERSONALLY:** Nickname is "D-Mac"...Is the son of John and Desiree McGuire...Has an older brother, Jereme, a younger brother, Jamel, and a younger sister, Jasmine...Helped his prep teams at Lincoln High School to three league championships and a 29-4 mark during his senior year.



**AARON MILES #12**

**Guard, 6-1 Kansas**



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Played with Elan Bearnais Pau-Orthez (France) in the Euroleague in 2006-07, and averaged 10.2 points and 3.7 assists per game in 20 games...Was a member of the Chicago Bulls 2006 Summer League Team...Signed by the Golden State Warriors as a free agent on September 29, 2005...Played in 19 games for the Warriors during the 2005-06 season...Also saw action with the NBA D-League Fort Worth Flyers in 2005-06...Averaged 10.1 points and 6.6 assists per game in 27 games with the Flyers...Was a member of the New York Knicks and Seattle Supersonics Summer League Teams in 2005.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Played four seasons at Kansas and earned Third Team All-Big 12 honors in both his junior and senior seasons...Finished his collegiate career ranked eighth in NCAA history with 954 career assists...Also owns the school record and Big 12 conference record in that category...Was named to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team in his last three seasons...As a senior, averaged 9.3 points per game and led the Big 12 with 7.3 assists per game.

**PERSONALLY:** Will compete for the Georgian National Team in the summer of 2007...Born and raised in Portland, Oregon...Attended Thomas Jefferson High School in Portland...Was a McDonald's High School All-American and the Gatorade Player of the Year in Oregon in 2001...Was also the starting quarterback for his high school football team.



**OLEKSIY PECHEROV #14**

**Forward/Center, 7-0 Ukraine**



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Signed by the Washington Wizards on July 5, 2007...Was drafted by Washington with the 18<sup>th</sup> overall pick in the first round of the 2006 NBA Draft...Played for BC Kyiv in 2006-07 and helped his team reach the Superleague semifinals...Had 20 points on 7-of-10 shooting, including 3-for-3 from three-point range in semifinal action for BC Kyiv in 2007...Averaged 12.0 points (.591 fg%) and 5.0 rebounds per game in three '07 EuroCup games...Played for the Wizards Summer League team in Las Vegas in 2006...Averaged 12.6 points on .462 shooting from the field, and added 7.6 rebounds per game in summer league action...Played for Paris Basket Racing in 2005-06 and averaged 11.2 points and 6.3 rebounds in 21.0 minutes per game...Played in two EuroCup games with BC Kyiv in 2004-05...Played for BK Politekhnik Kharkov in 2003-04 before moving up to BC Kyiv in the Ukrainian Superleague...Participated in the Global Games in Texas in the summers of 2003, 2004 and 2005 and earned Tournament MVP honors in 2004 after averaging 23.8 points and 10.0 rebounds.

**PERSONALLY:** Was the first ever international player selected by the Wizards franchise in the first round of the NBA Draft...Is also a member of the Ukrainian National Team...Is an avid soccer fan and played the sport for five years before turning to basketball...Did not play organized basketball until the age of 15.



**KEVINN PINKNEY #33**

**Forward/Center, 6-10 Nevada**



**PROFESSIONALLY:** After signing a 10-day contract with the Boston Celtics, appeared in six NBA games during the 2006-07 season...Averaged 5.2 points and 2.5 rebounds per game for the Celtics...Had a career-high 15 points at Milwaukee (4/4/07)...Grabbed a career-high seven rebounds vs. Milwaukee (4/13/07)...Played a career-best 24 minutes at Atlanta (4/10/07)...Also played for the Bakersfield Jam of the NBA Development League in 2006-07...Was an NBDL All-Star and a member of the All-NBDL Second Team...Averaged 18.6 points per game, tied for seventh in the NBDL, and 7.2 rebounds per game...Played with the Washington Wizards during 2006 preseason training camp.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Averaged a career-best 12.5 points and 7.7 assists per game on 54 percent shooting from the field in 31 games as a senior in 2004-05...Led the Wolf Pack with 22 points and 11 rebounds in a second-round 2005 NCAA tournament game against Illinois...Posted averages of 9.4 points, 5.7 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game as a junior...Averaged 7.3 points, 6.2 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game as a sophomore...Played four seasons at the University of Nevada...Averaged 3.2 points and 3.1 rebounds per game in 29 games as a freshman.

**PERSONALLY:** Is a native of Colton, California, a suburb of San Bernardino...Played basketball for Colton High School, where he averaged 21 points, 13 rebounds and five blocks per game during his senior year.



**DANILO PINNOCK #7**

**Guard, 6-5 George Washington**



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Selected in the second round (58<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2006 NBA Draft by the Dallas Mavericks and was acquired by the Los Angeles Lakers in a draft day trade from the Mavericks in exchange for a 2007 second round draft pick...Appeared in six preseason games for the Los Angeles Lakers and averaged 1.8 points and 2.0 rebounds per game...Played in 21 games for the Arkansas RimRockers of the NBDL and averaged 11.0 points, 6.8 rebounds and 4.6 assists per game.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Left George Washington University after his junior season and declared for the NBA Draft...Named to the Atlantic-10 All Conference First Team as a junior...Led the Colonials in scoring with 14.9 points per game as a junior...Also led team in steals with 2.46 per game; 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Atlantic 10...Was named Atlantic 10 Sixth Man of the Year as a sophomore...Named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team as a freshman.

**PERSONALLY:** Full name is Danilo Agustin Pinnock (pronounced Don-NEE-lo)...Nickname J.R. stands for Junior...Son of Danilo and Lucille Pinnock...Has one sister, Devena...Has two sons, Trey and Jaylen...Averaged 22 points, 10 rebounds and six assists as a senior at Coastal Christian Academy in Virginia Beach, VA...Played for the Panama National Team at the 2005 FIBA Americas Men's World Championship Qualifying Tournament in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic...Averaged 15.4 points, 4.6 rebounds and 1.7 steals in seven games for Panama, and helped the team to a 5-3 finish and one of five qualifying spots for the 2006 FIBA Men's World Championship in Japan...Studied sociology at George Washington.



## LEON RODGERS #9

Forward, 6-7 Northern Illinois



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Has played internationally for Holland's EiffelTowers Den Bosch in the Dutch League since 2004...In 2006, averaged 22.6 points and 5.4 rebounds per game and led EiffelTowers to the Dutch League Championship over the MPC Capitals...Was named the league MVP, and tallied a double-double with 23 points and 12 rebounds in a Game Seven victory.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Averaged 15.6 points and 6.6 rebounds per game in four collegiate seasons at Northern Illinois...Led the Huskies in both scoring and rebounding in his junior and senior seasons, averaging 19.0 points and 7.4 rebounds in his final two seasons...Holds the NIU school record for consecutive field goals made in a single game (13); established vs. Rockford College on December 6, 2000...Is the NIU Huskies' fifth all-time leading scorer...Also finished his career ranked third in 3-point field goal percentage (.406) and fourth in free throws made.

**PERSONALLY:** Hails from Columbus, OH and attended Eastmoor High School.



## KYLE VISSER #55

Center, 6-11 Wake Forest



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Was a candidate for the 2007 NBA Draft and participated in pre-draft workouts with 10 NBA teams.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Played four years at Wake Forest...Named First Team Academic All-District, and was named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll in 2003-04 and 2004-05...As a senior, started all 31 games and led Wake Forest in scoring (17.0 ppg), rebounding (7.4 rpg) and blocked shots (42)...Scored in double figures in 29 of 31 games...Averaged 18.5 points and 8.5 rebounds in two ACC Tournament games...As a junior, started in 17 of 34 games and scored in double figures six times...In his sophomore season, appeared in 33 games and scored in double figures three times...Started seven games as a freshman and scored in double figures five times.

**PERSONALLY:** Full name is Kyle Lee Visser...Earned his degree in Communication...Was born in Grand Rapids, Michigan...Son of Diane and Jim Visser...Has four siblings, Michelle, Dana, Kendra and Ryan...Made the Dean's List in each of his first four semesters at Wake Forest.



**JAMEEL WATKINS #44**

**Forward/Center, 6-11 Georgetown**



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Averaged 14.4 points and 11.0 rebounds per game playing for Dongbu in the Korean League in 2006...Has played internationally in China, Kuwait, Korea and the Philippines and statewide in the CBA, ABA and USBL...Played in various summer league and preseason camps with the Milwaukee Bucks, San Antonio Spurs, Seattle SuperSonics, Los Angeles Lakers, Houston Rockets and Washington Wizards...Signed with and was subsequently waived by the Houston Rockets in October 2003...Signed with the NBA D-League's Fayetteville Patriots on February 15, 2002 and averaged 8.4 points on .521 shooting, with 6.4 rebounds and 1.2 blocks in 50 games in 2002-2003.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Played four seasons at Georgetown University where he averaged 4.8 points on .447 shooting, along with 4.5 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game...Served as team co-captain as a senior...Started 31 of 31 games as a senior, and averaged 7.8 points and a team-high 7.2 rebounds per game...Also ranked second on the team with 58 blocked shots as a senior.

**PERSONALLY:** Is a native of Brooklyn, NY...Led the Paul Robeson High School basketball team to the New York City Championship in his junior year...Finished second in the City Championships his senior season... Was selected for Newsday's All-Brooklyn team...Nominated to the McDonald's All-American team...Was an Honorable Mention All-American in USA Today.



**NICK YOUNG #1**

**Guard/Forward, 6-7 Southern California**



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Selected in the first round (16<sup>th</sup> overall) by the Washington Wizards in the 2007 NBA Draft...Signed by Washington on July 5, 2007.

**COLLEGIATELY:** Earned First Team All-Pac-10 honors his sophomore and junior seasons...Also earned All-District honors from the NABC and USBWA both years...Finished his collegiate career as USC's sixth all-time leading scorer with 1,486 points...As a junior, ranked second in the Pac-10 in scoring (17.5 ppg), fifth in field goal percentage (.525) and tied for second in three-point field goal percentage (.440)...Recorded 22 points and seven rebounds in the second round of the NCAA Tournament vs. Texas...Scored 15 points vs. North Carolina in the 2007 Sweet Sixteen...As a sophomore, led the team in scoring (17.3 ppg) and rebounding (6.6 rpg)...Was one of only three players in the conference ranked in the top 10 in both scoring (fourth) and rebounding (sixth)...Scored in double figures in all but one contest...Recorded four double-doubles.

**PERSONALLY:** Was the focus of a documentary titled "Second Chance Season" which portrayed his life story and path to the NBA...Would like to work with children following his playing career...Names his brothers John and "T" as his biggest sports heroes.



**DERRICK ZIMMERMAN #31**

**Guard, 6-3 Mississippi State**



**NBA SUMMER LEAGUE**



**PROFESSIONALLY:** Originally selected by the Golden State Warriors in the second round (#40 pick overall) of the 2003 NBA Draft...Played internationally in 2006-2007 for both Air Avellino of Italy and Brose Baskets Bamberg in the German Basketball Bundesliga...Played two games with the NBA's New Jersey Nets during the 2005-06 season...Played in the NBA D-League for the Columbus Riverdragons (2004-05) and Austin Toros (2005-06)...Was named the NBDL's Defensive Player of the Year for two consecutive seasons (Austin 2005-06, Columbus 2004-05).

**IN COLLEGE:** Played four seasons at Mississippi State...Averaged 6.9 points, 3.3 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.61 steals in 127 games...Was twice named Third-Team All-SEC by the Associated Press and was a two-time member of the SEC All-Tournament team...Set all-time school records in career assists (514) and games played...Also ranks second on MSU's all-time list with 205 career steals...During his four year career, helped lead Bulldogs to a combined 80-47 record, including a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, an SEC Western Division championship and an SEC Tournament title.

**PERSONALLY:** Is a native of Monroe, LA...Was a four-year All-District performer at Wossman High School in Monroe, LA, playing for his father Dale...Was named Louisiana's Class 4A Player of the Year after averaging 30.2 points, 11.8 rebounds, 11.2 assists, 7.3 steals and 5.3 blocks per game as a senior...Earned Honorable Mention All-USA Team honors from USA Today...Left high school as Wossman's all-time leading scorer with 2,490 points...Is the son of Dale and Addie Zimmerman.
